Asthma (Reactive Airway Disease)

Note

If you see the telephone symbol () next to any sign below occurring in the student, call for help (EMS/9-1-1, school nurse, first aid-trained staff).

Look for

- Absent or hard and fast breathing
- Unconsciousness (unresponsive)
- Cannot get the student to respond; student not able to follow directions or think clearly
- Nostrils open wide
- Can't walk
- Bluish, pale skin color
- Sitting/leaning forward to aid breathing
- Anxious appearance

Listen for

- Can't talk without stopping to breathe
- Coughing
- Wheezing or unusual breathing sounds

Action

- 1. Begin CPR (p. 37) for absent breathing if you are trained.
- 2. Assist with administering prescribed asthma medication if you are trained.
- 3. Allow student to assume most comfortable position.
- 4. Use calm, quiet, voice to encourage student's slow, deep breathing and refocusing on pleasant thoughts/images.
- 5. Offer warm fluids if student can safely swallow.
- 6. If in 15 minutes student is breathing comfortably (and EMS/9-1-1 not called), student may return to class.
