# **Choking**

#### Note

If you see the telephone symbol ( ) next to any sign below occurring in the student, call for help (EMS/9-1-1, school nurse, first aid-trained staff).

# Look for

- Unresponsive
- Grasps at throat
- Cannot get the student to respond; student not able to follow directions or think clearly
- Inability to speak, breathe, cough
- Bluish, darkened facial color
- Sudden onset of weak, ineffective cough; high-pitched voice or breath sounds, gagging

## **Listen for** statements about

- Reports of laughing, talking, playing with food/foreign object in mouth.
- Student with known swallowing/chewing/breathing problems.

## **Action**

- 1. Give abdominal thrusts if student cannot cough, speak, or breathe.
- 2. If student is coughing, breathing, and continues to be able to speak, stay with the student and encourage coughing.
- 3. **Do not** reach into a conscious student's mouth.
- 4. If a nurse is unavailable, notify parents of incident occurring at school and need for prompt medical assessment.
- 5. If student loses consciousness, gently help to ground and begin CPR. Between chest compressions and rescue breaths, look into mouth and remove any visible object.
