

#### **WYNNE WATTS SCHOOL / LTCT**

Wynne Watts School, an accredited school, serves students residing at the Kerr Center, a Long-term Care and Treatment (LTCT) program. Educational programming includes academic credit leading to a diploma and various support services such as special education services and transition services.

Students enrolled participate in specific therapeutic groups based on their mental health needs, as the majority of students have experienced traumas, mental health challenges and /or behavioral health crisis events.



When students transition from the LTCT program, a MESD Educational Transition Specialist provides individualized educational advocacy, enrollment support and mentorship in the process from subacute to their next educational setting.

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## **HOSPITAL SCHOOL PROGRAM (HSP)**

The Hospital School Program provides flexible and motivational instruction and educational support to hospitalized students and their siblings ages 5 through 21. HSP teachers and educational assistants work with hospital staff, attending school districts, and with parents and other family members to provide the routine and mental stimulation of ongoing educational services. Together, they plan for a reasonable and realistic transition back to school following treatment. Special Education, ELL, and Transition Services are also provided.

## **FUNCTIONAL LIVING SKILLS (FLS)**

The FLS Full Service K-12 Program provides individualized instruction for students to develop communication skills, socially appropriate behaviors, and personal management skills that are commensurate with their cognitive level of functioning. Services are individualized for each student and may also include motor, physical, Assistive Technology, and some vocational training. Students receive services, including medical care, to meet their individual physical and health needs while in school.

## HELENSVIEW THERAPEUTIC SCHOOL

The Therapeutic program at Helensview provides individualized support to students identified for special education services who have intense mental health needs and require a small staff-student ratio.



## **PROGRAM STRUCTURE**

The therapeutic classrooms provide academic instruction, behavioral intervention, and social skills training, coupled with a mental health focus. Placement by local school districts occurs through resolution/contracts. This program has a low student/high staff ratio and includes a behavior coach and mental health therapist as well as a special education teacher and education assistants.



#### WHEATLEY SCHOOL

As the regional leader in providing services to our most impacted students, Wheatley School provides educational opportunities for students K-21 with significant cognitive and behavioral needs from across the metropolitan area. All students are staffed at a minimum of a 1:1 ratio with tailored, individualized schedules. Students are taught a behavioral and functional life skills curriculum to support a happy and healthy life with the goal of transitioning to a less restrictive environment and / or supported adult living.

#### **OUTDOOR SCHOOL**

During the fall and spring of each school year, local youth camps are leased to provide comfortable living facilities close to the outdoor laboratory where students can learn firsthand about natural science. The Environmental Education program offers this opportunity to all sixth grade students in Multnomah County and beyond.



## RESIDENTIAL EXPERIENCE

The program serves approximately 8,000 students per year. Instructional staff are employed to ensure a rich, 24-hour living experience where students and their teachers can explore forests and streams to learn about the diverse biology of the area. Approximately 1,600 high school students are selected and trained each year to serve as student counselors with the program.



#### RIVERCREST ACADEMY

Rivercrest Academy is free for students and offers a safe, sober, and supportive school environment for students recovering from substance use disorder. An accredited school, Rivercrest provides comprehensive high school academic and vocational programming coupled with personalized recovery support to promote personal, academic and community success. Recovery is a shared process and Rivercrest is committed to providing a space to succeed!

The ultimate goal is to return to a regular school placement.



#### **HELENSVIEW SCHOOL**

Helensview is an alternative middle/high school in Portland, OR that offers students multiple pathways to graduation with a standard diploma.

## **BARS TO BRIDGES (B2B)**

Bars to Bridges (B2B) promotes regular and consistent school attendance and increases positive educational transitions and outcomes for African American, Black, Biracial, and Multiracial youth, ages 11–25. B2B also provides supports to the families and siblings of qualifying youth. The program is grant-funded and serves students across Oregon.

#### **MIGRANT EDUCATION PROGRAM**

The Migrant Education Program provides supplemental academic support services to eligible students in component districts to ensure that migratory children who move among the states are not penalized in any manner by disparities among states in curriculum, graduation requirements, or state academic content and student academic achievement standards.

The goal of the MEP is to ensure that all migrant students reach challenging academic standards and graduate with a high school diploma (or complete a GED) that prepares them for responsible citizenship, further learning, and productive employment.

Oregon families have a variety of educational options. One of those is home schooling. MESD provides home school registration for Multnomah County families that opt to home school. MESD also supports home school families by providing online student records management and online resource lists. Home school resources are provided in English and Spanish. Families can register using our online portal or via written notification.

We also provide contract-based education services in Clackamas, Lane, Linn, and Yamhill Counties.






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


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
