TRiO is a federally funded program that supports low-income high school students and students who are the first in their family to go to college.

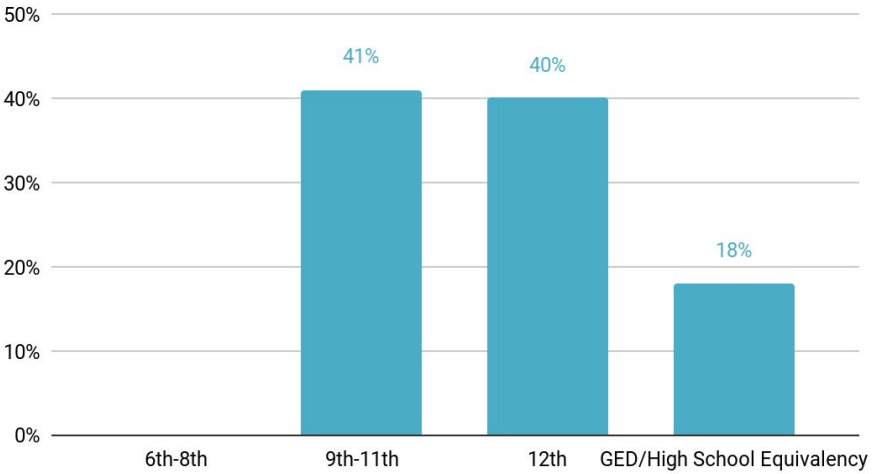

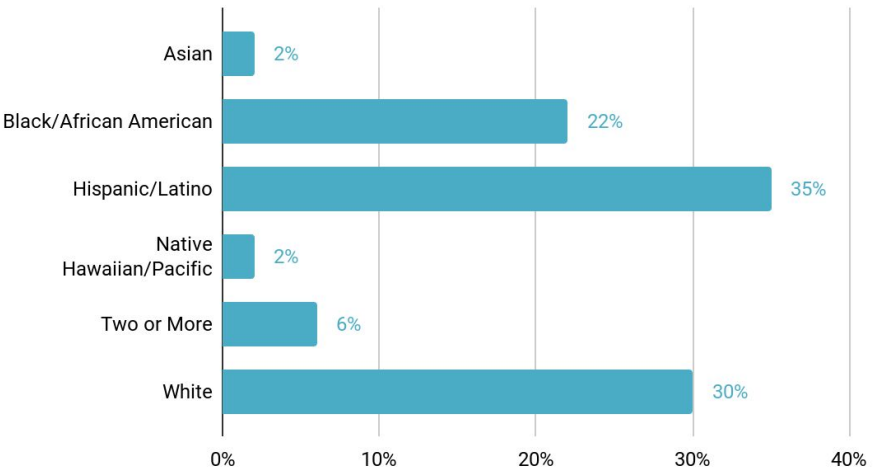

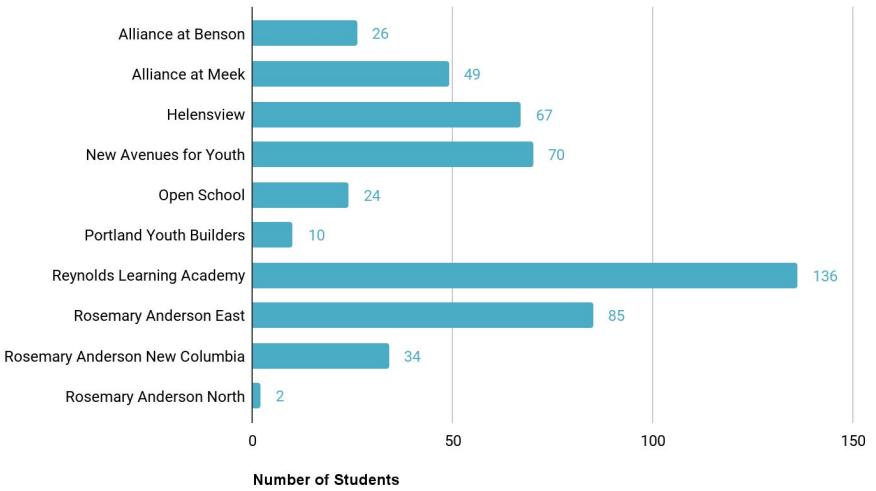
## Grade Levels Served



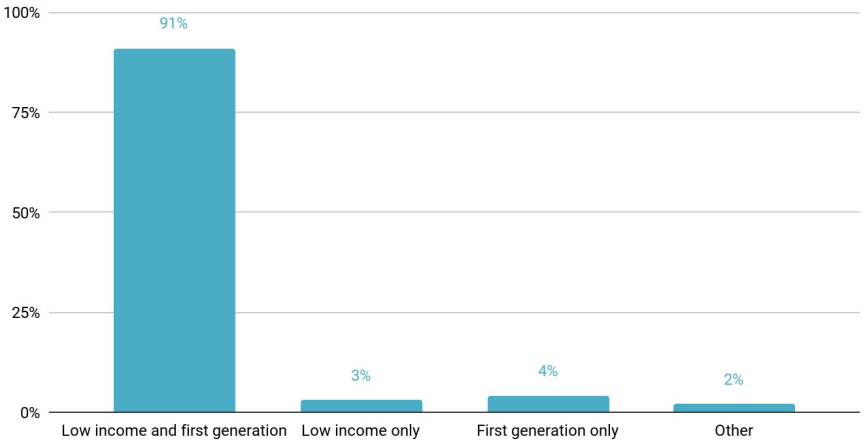
## Race/Ethnicity of Students Served

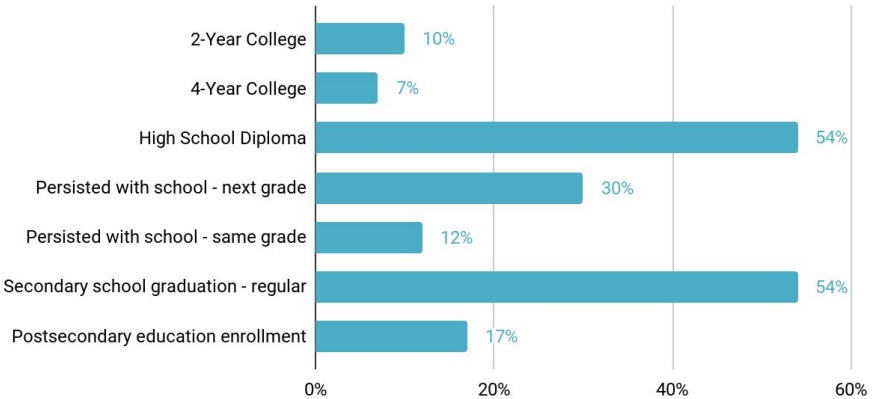
