








# Functional Living Skills

## Program Description

The Functional Living Skills is a full service program that serves K-12 and Transition-age students, providing individualized instruction for students to develop communication skills, socially appropriate behaviors, and personal management skills that are commensurate with their cognitive level of functioning. Services are individualized for each student and may also include motor, physical, assistive technology, and some vocational training. Students receive services, including medical care, to meet their individual physical and health needs while in school. Staff provides intensive physical and sensory management to support students throughout the day and ensure their success. The Functional Living Skills program serves students from Multnomah County component school districts, and other school districts by contract.

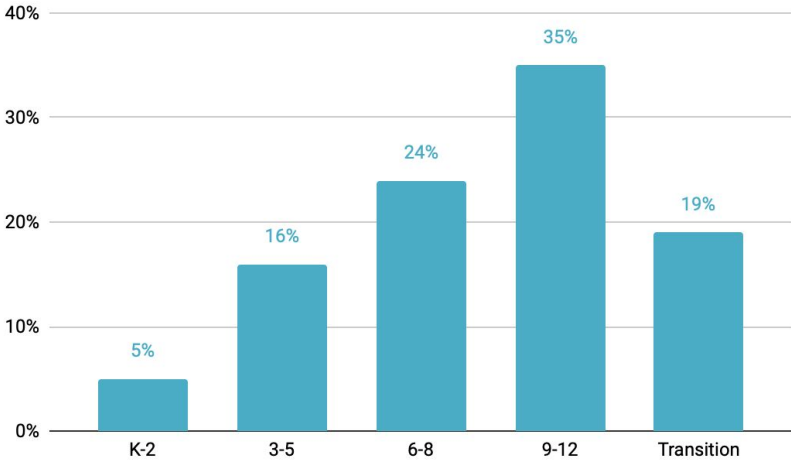

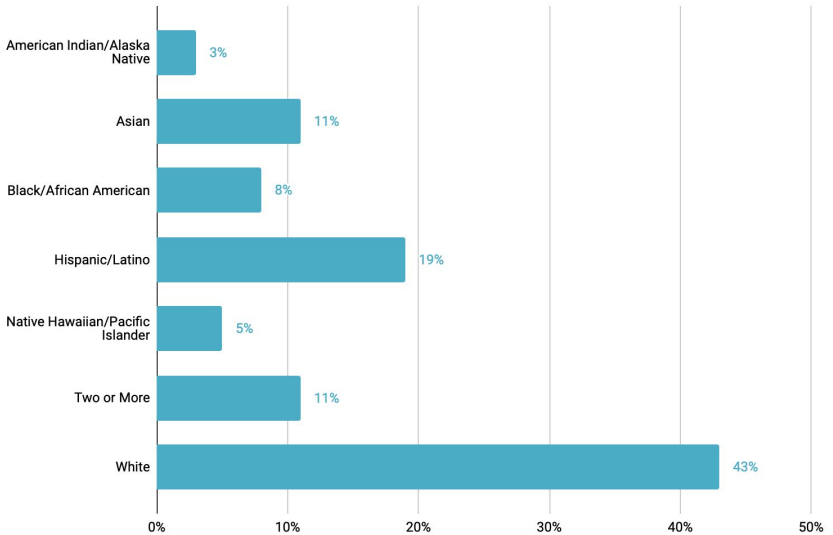
# Student Demographics 2022-23

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## Grade Levels Served

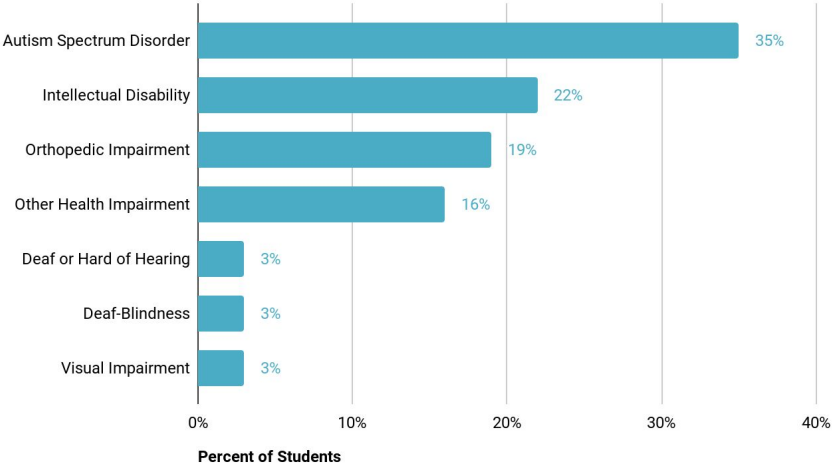


## Race/Ethnicity of Students Served



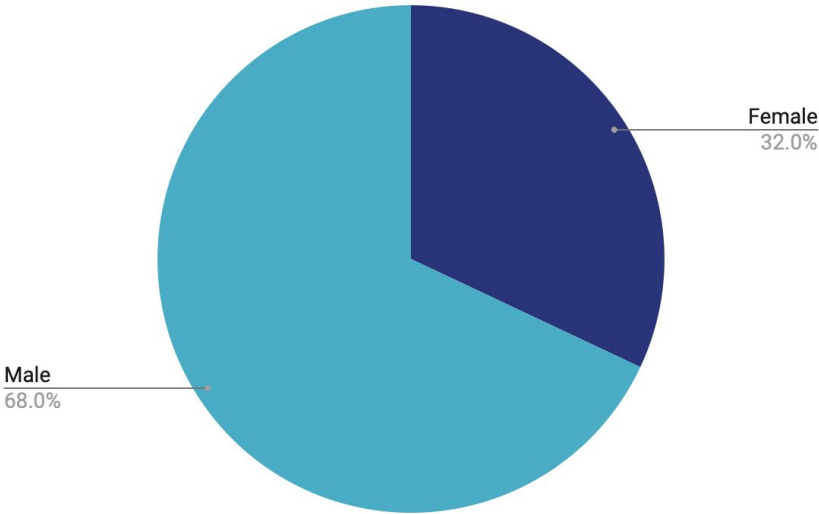
