
Program Description

Educational Services leading up to a diploma and/or GED are provided to students (ages 11-18) detained and/or incarcerated in the Linn Juvenile Detention Center in accordance with Oregon Administrative Rule 581-015-2585. The Linn JDEP School, located next to the Oak Creek Youth Correctional Facility, currently houses a maximum of seventeen youth at one time.




