Program Description

The Migrant Education Program is a federally funded program intended to help ensure that children from migrant families reach challenging academic standards and graduate with a high school diploma (or complete a GED) that prepares them for responsible citizenship, further learning, and productive employment. Federal funds are allocated by formula based on each state's per pupil expenditure for education and counts of eligible migrating children, age 3 through 21, residing within the state.

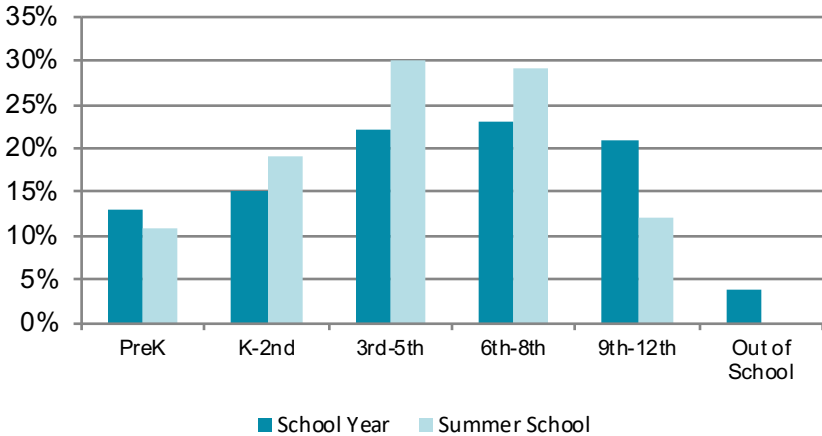

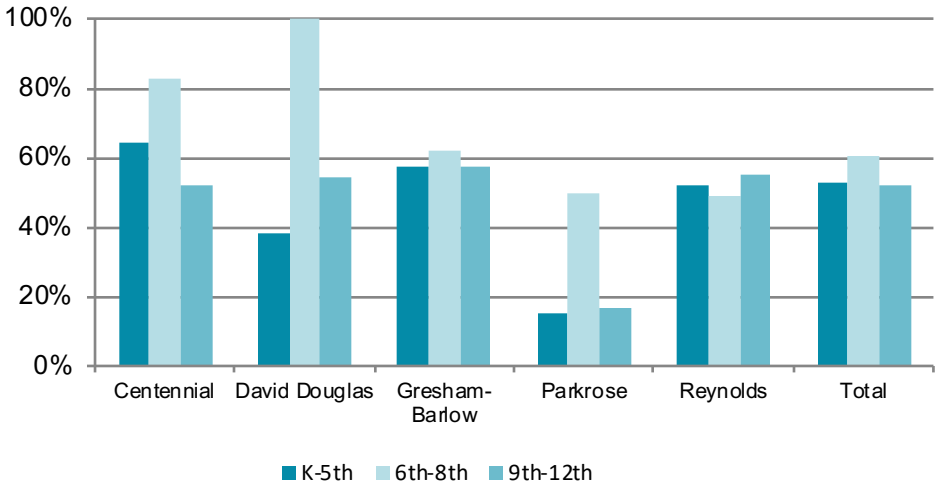

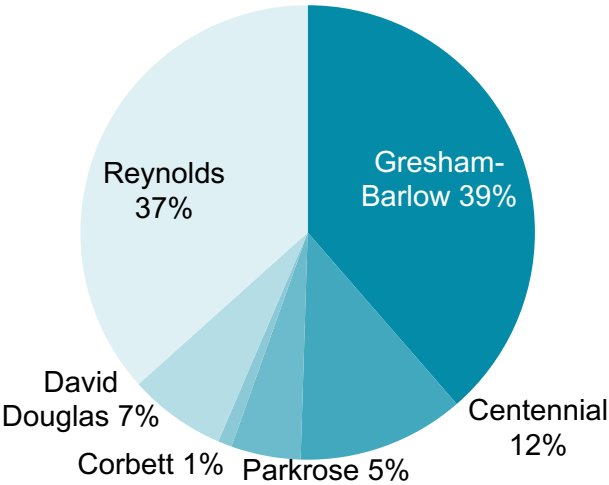

Districts Served*



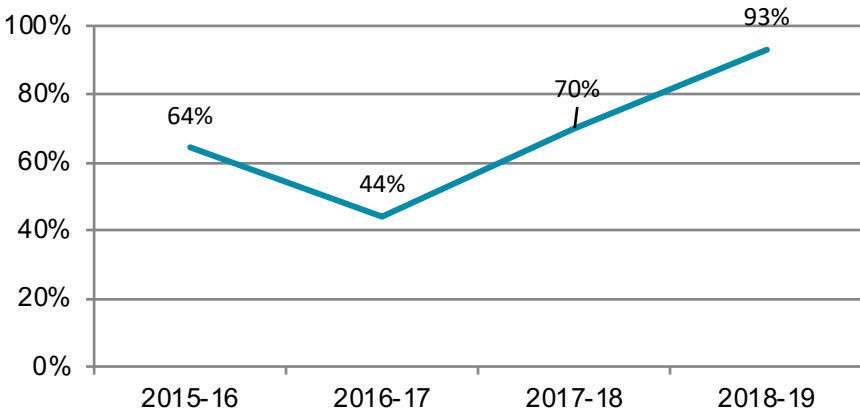
