TRAINING REQUIRED FOR UNREGULATED ASSISTIVE PERSON (UAP)

By definition of the Oregon State Board of Nursing, a **UAP** "is a person who may have training which documents their knowledge and competency but they do not have a scope of practice or authorized to perform nursing tasks." Each training class has specific requirements for the instructor and a defined length of time for certification.
