### TRAINING REQUIRED FOR UNREGULATED ASSISTIVE PERSON (UAP)

By definition of the Oregon State Board of Nursing, a **UAP** “is a person who may have training which documents their knowledge and competency but they do not have a scope of practice or authorized to perform nursing tasks.” Each training class has specific requirements for the instructor and a defined length of time for certification.

| First Aid/CPR/AED                    | Trained to 2015 ILCOR standard. Participants must be able to complete return demonstrations.   | 1:12                       | 2 Years                 | 240 min. (4 hours)        | Only in person  |
