
I am going Down on the Portland Tram!




A photo guide on how to ride the Portland Arial Tram.

Oh boy! I am going to go DOWN on the Portland Tram. It is fun to go on the Portland Tram. It goes high into the air but it is super safe. To find the Tram you have to walk through OHSU.



Watch for the Tram signs! They will lead you to the loading platform. You can look out at the city from the platform. It is high up but don't be scared. It is super safe!



You don't need a ticket to ride DOWN on the Tram. It is free!
It is \$4.00 to ride up.

Since you don't need a ticket to go DOWN go ahead and get on
the tram. Hold onto a railing!



There will be a person who runs the Tram. He will tell you when the Tram is about to move. First the door will close and then the Tram will bounce a little bit. Don't be scared! It is OK for the Tram to bounce. It is exciting and fun!

Look! We are passing the other Tram as it goes UP. You can wave to the people who are going up!




Wow! Now we are over the highway! The cars look so tiny!
