Willamette Falls is the 2nd largest water fall in the United States! It is in Oregon City and it is very easy to visit. But when you go to Willamette Falls you have to be very careful.



This is the viewpoint at Willamette Falls. You drive up in your car and park. On the right side is a wall and on the left side is a very busy road. See all the cars on the busy road?

Don't go in the road. Instead you want to get on the sidewalk next to the stone wall. The sidewalk is a safe place to be.

The road can be kind of noisy. If it is too noisy you can stay in the car and look at the waterfall from inside the car!

This is the view of the Willamette Falls. It is very beautiful. This man is being very safe while he looks at the falls. He is standing on the sidewalk. He is very smart and knows the sidewalk is the safest place to be.



See the stone wall? You cannot climb on the stone wall. This man knows it is not safe to be on the wall. He is only going to stand on the sidewalk. He even put his hands in his pocket.

It is kind of high at the viewpoint! Don't be scared. Remember, if it is too scary for you, you can sit in the car and see the falls.

Have you ever seen such a big waterfall? It is 40 feet tall and 1500 feet wide. Niagara Falls is the only waterfall in the United States that is bigger!




There are rapids to look at and even fog and mist! That sure is a lot of water going over those falls.
