



Here is a picture of the library. If you have to cross the street, make sure you use the crosswalk.



For Sensory Storytime we go to the back of the library. There is a parking lot and some doors.



Let's walk down the sidewalk to the door with the sign.

This is where you go for storytime.



Remember! We have to be quiet at the library. When you talk, use a quiet voice. People like a quiet voice at the library.

When we go to storytime, everyone sits on the floor and listens to a story. Sometimes the librarian uses some puppets.

Sometimes everyone gets to sing a song!

Storytime is very fun and safe. Moms and dads and brothers and sisters can all go to storytime. Don't be scared by all the people. It is very safe!

Find a nice spot to sit and let's be really quiet and listen to the librarian!

Inside the storytime room, the librarian is going to read to us. Look! Here is the librarian talking to some kids. They are so happy to go to storytime! They are sitting on the floor and listening.

Sometimes the kids make noise and laugh. That's OK too.



There is a glass door that goes out to the library. The bathroom is through the glass door.



This is where the bathroom is. Look for the sign for the bathroom.



What should you do after you go to the bathroom?

Wash your hands!
