Wynne Watts School is an accredited educational program for students with socio-emotional needs and / or long term care and treatment needs. Students are enrolled in multi-grade, self-contained classrooms and grouped by their academic progression. Students are also placed in specific therapeutic groups based on their mental health needs and challenges which prevent them from being placed in a less restrictive educational setting.

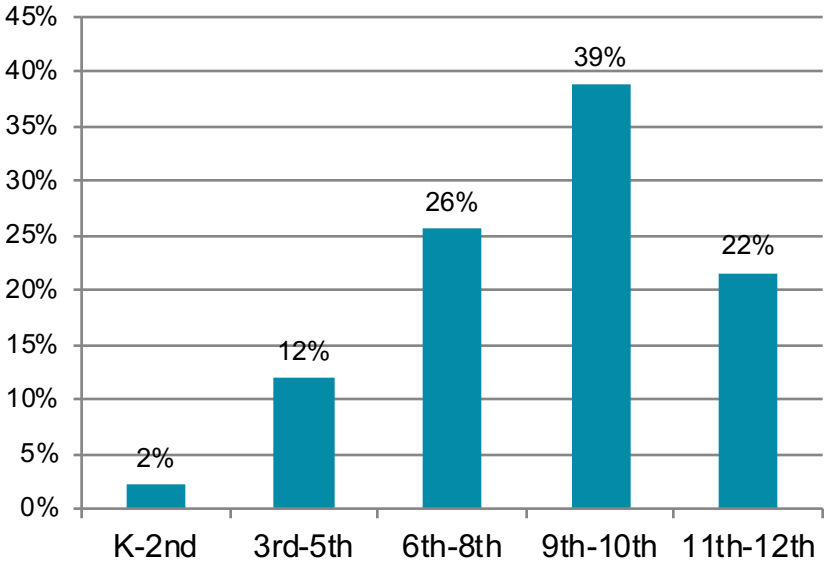


% Students With Multiple Enrollments

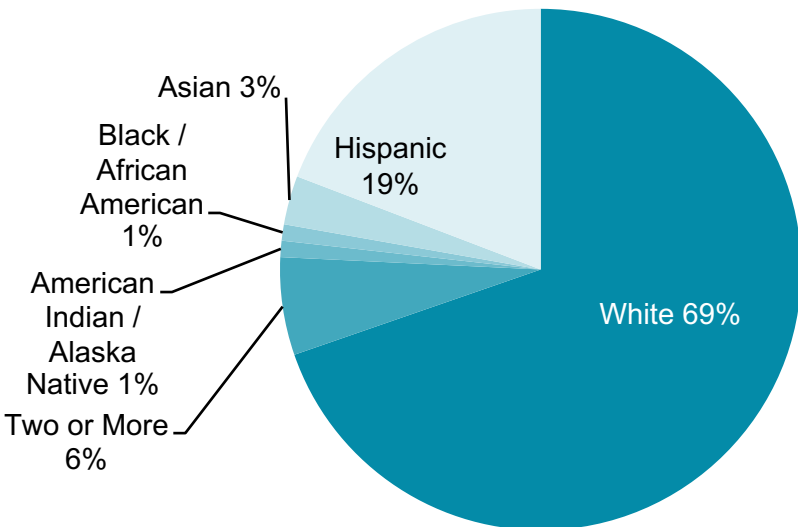

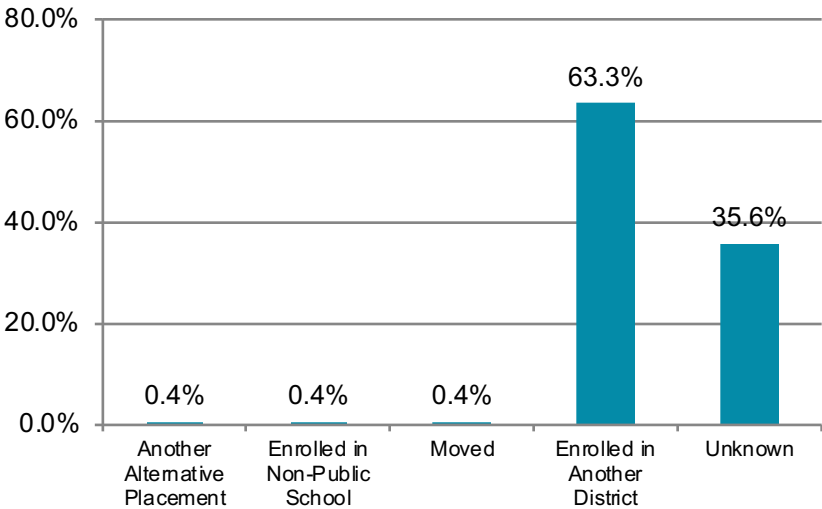

Performance Measures

Partway through the school year, Wynne Watts transitioned from Let’s Go Learn to the Wide Range Achievement Test (WRAT) as the primary formative assessment. The WRAT serves as an initial academic achievement evaluation, re-evaluation, or progress measure for any student. Student growth is measured as Grade Equivalent.

Participation rate criteria are in place to ensure district tests all eligible students.
